

Defining OSA

Obstructive Sleep Apnea is a serious health condition.

OSA is a life-long medical condition that can affect your sleep, health and quality of life. It has been linked to hypertension, diabetes, heart disease, work and driving related accidents and stroke.

It can have a significant impact on quality of life, placing unnecessary strain on relationships between bed partners, family and in the workplace.

If you or a loved one have OSA or display symptoms such as snoring, excessive daytime sleepiness, or pauses in breathing while sleeping, treatment is essential.

What causes OSA?

During sleep, muscles relax, including those that control the tongue and throat. The soft tissue at the back of your throat can sag, narrowing and constricting the airway.

Although OSA sufferers may experience hundreds of apnea episodes per night, they are unlikely to remember any of them. In fact, sufferers who live alone or sleep separately may not be aware of their condition.

What services will the dentist perform?

Initial Visit — Thoroughly examine your teeth and mouth to confirm your oral health status, as well as ensure that you are dentally appropriate for the device.

At that time, a bite registration and impressions will be taken so that the SomnoDent prescription can be completed and sent to SomnoMed's medical manufacturing facility by the dentist.

Delivery Appointment — The SomnoDent will be placed and checked for fit.

The dentist will also instruct you on how to insert and remove it yourself, including how to clean and care for your SomnoDent.

Calibration Visits — The purpose of these visits is to determine the optimal position of the device.

Follow-up Visits — Once the optimal position has been achieved, the dentist will refer you back to your sleep physician for a follow-up visit.
